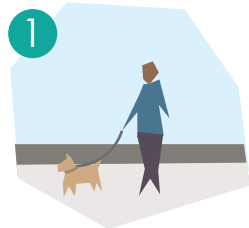


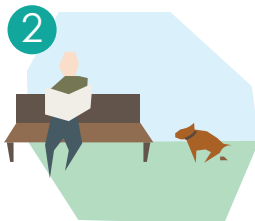
There are lots of beautiful town and countryside parks, beaches, and nature reserves in Teignbridge, and we want everyone to enjoy them. So, we've put together a handy guide focused on dog walkers, to let you know about all the places you can visit.

To make the most out of your walks, we ask you to respect the space, and others, by:



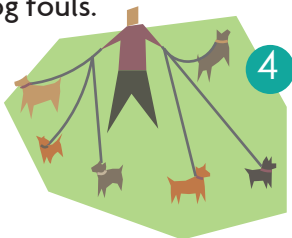
1 Keep your dogs on a 1m fixed lead when next to roads, on shared routes such as cycle paths, public bridleways, and when asked to by a dog warden.

Paying attention to what your dog is doing at all times.



3 Carrying bags, poop scoops, and other equipment for if your dog fouls.

Walking no more than six dogs at once - and keeping them all under control.



5 Keeping your dog out of restricted areas, such as play parks, and beaches during the summer.

Picking up after your dog if it fouls, and disposing of waste in a dog bin or a normal bin.



Failure to comply may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice or prosecution.

Did you know?

By law, all dogs must wear a collar and tag with the owner's name and address, and be microchipped.

Under the Public Space Protection Order, you are required to clean up after your dog and keep them under control, for the wellbeing and enjoyment of yourself, your dog, and others. For more information visit teignbridge.gov.uk/dogpspo

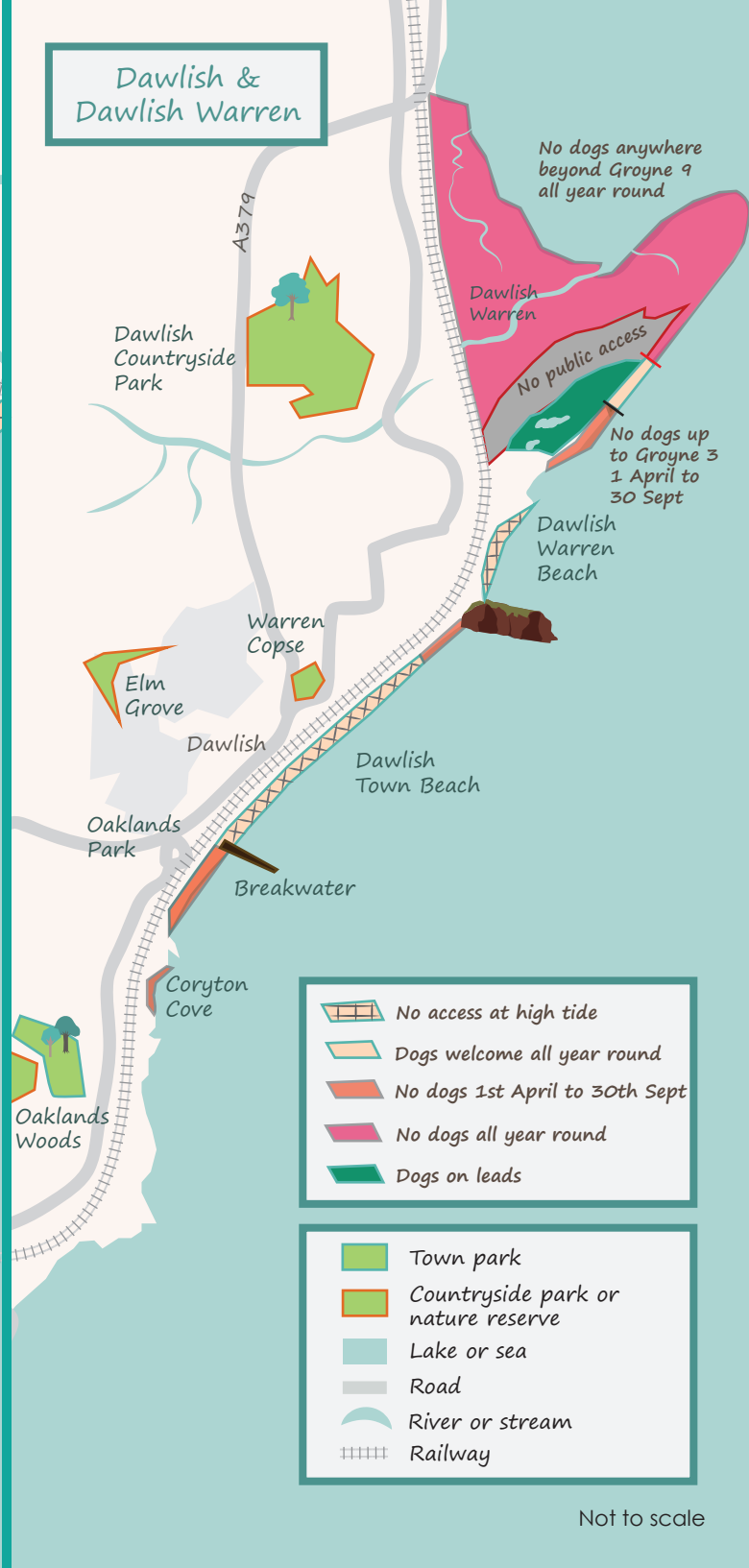
