1. One parishioner was interested in volunteering for speed watch. Cllr Wareham provided the names of 4 people who are interested, Cllr Dummett indicated another 4 who were interested. There is a potential of upto 14 people who may be prepared to volunteer. A question was raised by one of our Cllrs on whether or not the parish council would have any extra weight in getting any of these matters sorted.

4.The other parishioners felt the village has been very inclusive and wanted to thank the council for being part of the events that have taken place over the last year and mention was made of the jubilee. The council indicated that it looks forward to hearing from the parishioners.
